







First steps towards Artificial Culture in **Robot Societies**

- Our aim is to illuminate the processes and mechanisms of the emergence of culture in social agents...
- by implementing robot-robot imitation (social learning) to study the emergence and evolution of robot 'memes' as they propagate across a robot collective



Robot meme

a sequence of movements, or sounds, copied from one robot to another, by imitation

Toward artificial culture: Robot traditions

sustained and measurable emerging differences in memes between two or more groups of robots, where those groups have divided or split off from a common ancestral group and the memes are traceable to common root memes in the ancestral group

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
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

Trajectory plot of open-ended movement-meme evolution (2 robots). Seed meme: triangle (meme 1). Selection strategy: save every meme learned, select which one to enact at random with equal probability.



A computational model of gene-meme co-evolution (Bayesian network) with competing 'memes' (Health advice and Advertising) co-evolving with 'genes' for Diabetes and Self-control.
